First Responder Program

The Autism Society is developing a gold-standard first responder and criminal justice curriculum, training, and certification program. This program addresses the need for improved interactions between first responders and the Autism community. Leveraging a "train-the-trainer" approach, the Autism Society will impact positive change at the national, state, and local levels.

The First Responder program will focus on preventative strategies and de-escalation techniques that increase positive and safe interactions between the Autism community and first responders.

Water Safety and Wandering Program

The Autism Society's Water and Wandering Program is a national effort to increase water safety education and training across the Autism community, in order to decrease the tragic loss of life caused by water and wandering-related accidents. This program works to not only prevent wandering-related tragedies, but to increase water safety skills among Autistic individuals and their families.

The Autism Society seeks to **develop an adaptive aquatics curriculum** that aims to support instructors and the Autism community nationwide.



Kevin & Avonte's Law Program Overview

Kevin and Avonte's Law honors the memory of Kevin Wils and Avonte Oquendo, two boys with Autism who tragically perished after wandering away from supervised settings. **The law aims to create safer communities for people with Autism, Alzheimer's, and other developmental disabilities.** Since the law was passed in March of 2018, it has increased funding to help reduce the risk of injury or death related to wandering for individuals with Autism.

In late 2022, the Autism Society of America was awarded funding to help support technical training and assistance (TTA) in support of Kevin and Avonte's Law. As part of this role, the Autism Society is leading a national effort to prevent water and wandering-related deaths.
